Reference: Grand Jury Report-Sex Trafficking of Girls

Honorable Judge Borris,

On June 22nd, 2012, the Orange County Grand Jury released its report on *Sex Trafficking of Girls*. In compliance with California Penal Code 933 and applicable subsections, the Fullerton Police Department is forwarding it's response to you:

Grand Jury Findings:

- Additional training needed on Human Trafficking: Although training has already been implemented, it will be re-initiated with the inclusion of the Orange County Task Force support services.
- 2. **Child Victims require specialized shelter:** The Orangewood Children's Facility is available via Orange County Child Protective Services.
- 3. Child Victims Often Misidentified: Occurrences should be minimized through training.
- 4. Trafficked minors often flee non-secure shelters: Occurrences may be minimized through training
- 1275.1 CPC allows courts to determine probable cause in confirming suspect bail funds were obtained legally: Information covered during training
- 6. No safe home currently exists to shelter victims from traffickers: Matter has been addressed via Task force and Child Protective Services to utilize Orangewood.
- 7. No current database to check identity of victims of sex trafficking: We have not been notified of a county, state or federal database to query or add such information.

Grand Jury Recommendations:

- Additional law enforcement training needed: The Fullerton Police Department will provide briefing training to patrol and support details starting approximately 7-21-12 based on "The Crime of Human Trafficking: A Law Enforcement Guide from IACP guidelines. The training should be completed within one month.
- 2. **Database tracking system of trafficking cases**: The Fullerton Police Department has established a specific charging section under 236.1 CPC to document and categorize these types of cases to aid in tracking.
- 3. Law Enforcement should more frequently utilize 1275.1 CPC to qualify bail money on an in-custody arrest. The Fullerton Police Department will incorporate this information with the training listed in response #1.
- 4. County Executive Officer to direct agencies to develop strategic plan to address problem and meet food, shelter, treatment and protection from exploitation: The Fullerton Police Department is open to reviewing any plan that could have an impact in these areas that will work within its available resources.
