Attached is the City of Placentia's Response to the 2006-2007 Orange County Grand Jury report, "Assembly Bill 939 Waste Diversion: Are We Finally Making Progress?" Included is the requested response to Finding F-6 and Recommendation R-6.

Finding F-6: "The presence of non-franchise haulers and so-called "Ghost Haulers" bins, in cities which bypass the recycling system, needs to be corrected in order to establish the waste haulers' confidence that their municipalities are looking out for their best interests."

Response to Finding F-6: The City of Placentia agrees with the Grand Jury's Finding F-6. The presence of non-franchise haulers and unauthorized bins operating within a franchise city undermines the city's recycling efforts and AB939 compliance. However, misreported tonnage is difficult to identify as the misreporting occurs at the landfills. The landfills should enact policies to ensure confirmation of the originating source and location of the tonnage.

Recommendation R-6: "Municipalities need to solve their unauthorized waste bin problems by enacting city ordinances forbidding these practices, imposing fines, including stepped-up fines for additional violations, and impounding unauthorized bins.

Response to Recommendation R-6: The recommended action has been implemented. The City of Placentia enacted Ordinance O-2002-09 "Unlawfully placed refuse containers" in 2002. The ordinance states that unauthorized waste bins may not be placed within the City of Placentia. Upon report of an unauthorized waste bin within the city a City of Placentia Code Enforcement Officer inspects the location to verify that it is an unauthorized bin. Upon verification, the Code Enforcement Officer posts a notice stating that the bin is unauthorized and must be removed within 24 hours to avoid being impounded. The Code Enforcement Officer visits the site again in 24 hours, if the binhas not been removed it is impounded.

Upon being impounded the City of Placentia sends a letter to the waste disposal company that owns the bin to notify them of the violation of Placentia Municipal Code, the resulting impoundment of their bin and fees owed to the City. The fees include a \$100/per container impoundment fee, bin storage fee and fees for all staff time spent impounding the vehicle and billing the company. The unauthorized bin owner is required to pay all fees before they are allowed to pick up their bin from impoundment (they must show their City of Placentia receipt in order to receive bin).

In addition, if the company in violation fails to claim their containers within ninety days the containers and contents are disposed of and the company is now responsible for those additional disposal costs as well.

In 2004 the City of Placentia posted 12 notices and impounded 1 bin. In 2005 the City posted 18 notices and impounded 0 bins, in 2006 22 notices were issued and 2 bins were impounded.

In addition, we dispute the 2004 Diversion Rate listed for the City of Placentia (listed as 49%) on page 13. Enclosed with this letter you will find the Integrated Waste Management Board's Countywide, Regionwide, and Statewide Jurisdiction Diversion Progress Report for Year 2004. You will see that on page 2 of the report the City of Placentia's Diversion Rate for year 2004 was 55% and was approved by the California Integrated Waste Management Board.
