## **RESPONSES TO GRAND JURY FINDINGS**

In accordance with California Penal Code  $\delta$  933 and  $\delta$  933.05, each Grand Jury recommendation requires a response from the governmental entity to which it is addressed.

2002-2003 Grand Jury Findings	City of Rancho Santa Margarita Responses
Finding 1: There is a lack of uniformity in local building codes involving roofs for identical environmental conditions within Orange County.	Agree. However, not every community in Orange County has identical environmental conditions.
<b>Finding 2:</b> The testing and qualification standards of wood shakes and shingles are below the environmental conditions of Orange County.	Generally, agree.
Finding 3: The cities' and county's roofing codes do not adequately take into account the climate, particularly the Santa Ana winds, and topographical conditions unique to Orange County.	Generally, agree.
Finding 4: Fire conflagrations stress finite fire fighting resources especially during the period of Santa Ana winds.	Agree.

Agree.  During the next code adoption cycle, we will consider amending the Building Code to add a more restrictive roof-covering requirement, when more than 50 percent of the roof is replaced within one year.
