Ocean View School District is unaware of the protocols used by other Orange County districts.

The Respondent disagrees wholly or partially with the finding	Ocean View School District prioritizes the safety of students and staff, conducts regular active shooter drills, and continues to train staff and students on active shooter safety measures. Ocean View School District is unaware of the protocols used by other Orange County districts.

F4	Safety and security plans for on-campus before and after-school programs are not adequately addressed by school districts.	Disagree. The Respondent disagrees wholly or partially with the finding	The Ocean View School District before and after school programs use a similar approach to safety as that used during the regular school day. There are scheduled safety drills, one point of entry onto the campus, and parents/guardians sign students in and out daily. Ocean View School District is unaware of the protocols used by other Orange County districts.
F5	While many Orange County public schools have installed fences, cameras, and other methods to address the issue of active shooters on a campus, there are still opportunities for improvement.	Disagree. The Respondent disagrees wholly or partially with the finding	In addition to perimeter fencing and security cameras, the main school office door is locked at every Ocean View School District school and equipped with a buzzer to request entry into the school. Ocean View School District is unaware of the methods used in other Orange County districts.
F6	Not all schools utilize a system for monitoring campus visitors.	Disagree. The Respondent disagrees wholly or partially with the finding	Ocean View School District monitors campus visitors and volunteers using the Raptor system to screen all individuals against a national registry. The Raptor system provides a badge to identify those approved to be on campus.
F7	While there is an increased awareness of the benefits of mental health counseling, not all school districts have implemented these programs in all schools.	Disagree. The Respondent disagrees wholly or partially with the finding	Ocean View School District has mental health counseling available to students on every campus and is increasing the number of mental health staff for the 2023-2024 school year. Ocean View School District is unaware of the programs provided in other Orange County districts.
F8	School Resource Officers (SROs) are a valuable asset for school safety, yet many cities/districts do not allocate sufficient funds to hire needed officers.	Disagree. The Respondent disagrees wholly or partially with the finding	The Huntington Beach, Fountain Valley and Westminster Police Departments provide Ocean View School District with School Resource Officers to support schools in each city. Ocean View School District is unaware of the resources provided by other police agencies and used in Orange County districts.

The Respondent disagrees wholly or partially with the finding	The main school office door is locked at every Ocean View School District school and equipped with a buzzer to request entry into the school. Ocean View School District is unaware of the measures used in other Orange County districts.
