"The Spanish Village by the Sea" City of San Clemente Responses to Finding & Recommendations: 2022-2023 Orange County Grand Jury report, "E-bikes Friend or Foe":

Findings and Responses

F1 The majority of Orange County's 34 cities do not have ordinances or policies in place, which makes it difficult to address the safe operation and regulation of E-bikes leading to confusion.

City's Response:

Agree; however, the City of San Clemente has not conducted an independent survey to confirm this finding.

F2 Due to the increasing incidence of E-bike injuries and deaths, there is a need for consistent and accurate tracking by law enforcement and first responders, which does not exist now.

City's Response:

Agree.

F3 Training and education on E-bike use and safety varies from city to city causing confusion amongst bike riders

City's Response:

Agree; however, the City of San Clemente has not conducted an independent survey to confirm this finding.

Recommendations and Response

R1 Each Orange County city should have specific policies that define the rules of the road for use of E-bikes in their communities by December 1, 2024. (F1)

City's Response:

The Recommendation has been implemented in specific areas of the City, such as Beaches and Trails, and further implementation is contemplated through future amendments to the San Clemente Municipal Code to address areas in the City's right-of-way by December 1, 2024.

R2 Each Orange County city should have a mechanism in place to report accidents, injuries and deaths involving E-bikes by December 1, 2024. (F2)

City's Response:

This Recommendation requires implementation by the City's contracted public safety personnel, specifically the Orange County Sheriff's Department and the Orange County Fire Authority because those agencies are responsible for traffic enforcement and medical responses withing the City of San Clemente, and subsequent reporting of such activities. The City of San Clemente will support these agencies in implementing this recommendation to the extent possible by December 1, 2024.

R3 Each Orange County city should research and develop outreach and education programs regarding the safe operation of E-bikes for their residents by December 1, 2024. (F3)

City's Response:

The Recommendation has been implemented. The City, along with the Orange County Sheriff's Department staff conducts bicycle/E-bike training at various events throughout the year, including a Bicycle Rodeo and trainings at local schools.
